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Subject: Violence Prevention Policy

Illinois Institute of Technology (Illinois Tech) is committed to protecting the safety and well-being of faculty, staff, and students, and the greater Illinois Tech community across all its campuses. To support this commitment, the university has developed the Violence Prevention Policy.

The university will not tolerate acts or threats of violence, and other aberrant, dangerous, or threatening behavior whether by students, employees, visitors, or other third parties on university-owned, -controlled, or -leased properties; at off-campus locations administered by the university; or in its programs or while using university-owned or administered systems such as email.

In accordance with the [Illinois Campus Security Enhancement Act of 2008](#), the university will take all appropriate actions to prevent and respond to acts or threats of violence. As part of this effort, Illinois Tech has implemented the Campus Violence Prevention Plan (CVPP). This plan outlines a comprehensive framework identifying how the university works to prevent, mitigate, and respond to potential threats. The CVPP defines the roles and responsibilities of various departments and units to ensure a thorough, fact-based assessment and coordinated response to any identified risks of concerning or threatening behavior or acts of violence.

All members of the Illinois Tech community are expected to cooperate with the CVPP and participate in efforts to identify and monitor concerning or threatening behavior. Community members share the responsibility of reporting any such behaviors or threats through the university's [Incident Reporting Form](#) to help maintain a safe and secure environment for all.
